Project Summary and Significance

The 2014 PECC Next Generation Program will bring together 50 promising young leaders from PECC member economies for a 3 day conference in Beijing including Participating in the PECC General Meeting and Standing Committee Meeting. The program will give young scholars from diverse backgrounds a platform to express their views about the future of the economic cooperation in the Asia Pacific region.

Objectives

- To promote exchange of opinions on regional economic cooperation, and enhance intercultural dialogue.
- To interact with the PECC opinion leaders on issues related to regional economic cooperation.
- To pass on the spirit of regional cooperation to the younger generation.
- To empower the younger generation with the ability to influence the policy makers.

Delegates

PECC member committees will nominate and sponsor 1 or 2 mature next generation scholars from their own economies to participate in the PECC Next Generation Program. Given availability and affordability of the host, interested member economies may send more on the "first come, first serve" basis.

Expenses

- Delegates' international travel and accommodation in Beijing will be covered by their respective PECC member committees.
- Transportation, food and costs of running this program in Beijing will be covered by CNCPEC.

- People to people connectivity- young scholars as key stake holders of cross-border education
- Role of young people in promoting innovative green economy
- Bogor Goals and beyond
- Nurturing youth leadership among young thought leaders and scholars in the Asia-pacific region.
