DUAL DEGREE Master Korean European Studies (MAKES)

Profile

The Dual Degree Master of Korean European Studies (MAKES) is a 2-year Master program offered by the University of Tübingen and the Seoul National University (SNU). It provides educational opportunities to gain in-depth knowledge on Europe and the European Union and its relations to Korea and the East Asian region.

The MAKES program focuses on the relations between Korea and Europe in a regional and global context. The students are, therefore, encouraged to pursue a comparative, interdisciplinary, and transnational approach to explore the multi-dimensional relations between Korea and Germany as well as between the East Asian and the European regions. The program is specifically aimed at GSIS students with a deep interest in Europe. A certain level of expertise is only achieved by experiencing firsthand the society, culture, and everyday life of the specific country or region in question. MAKES combines a challenging study program with the acquisition of intercultural competency and skills.

GSIS students in Tübingen are based at the Korean Studies Section. They take classes with Tübingen's Korean Studies Master students focusing on Korean-European relations as well as pursue their different GSIS majors at the renowned Faculty of Economics and Social Sciences. Courses in the fields of International Business and Economics are available for the GSIS International Commerce Majors and in Political Science for students majoring in Area Studies and International Relations. Additionally, the European and International Studies program offers summer and winter schools. Thus, MAKES follows a truly international and interdisciplinary approach to Korean-European Studies.

OPPORTUNITIES



International Studies in the Heart of Europe

GSIS students can choose to apply for the MAKES program after entering their regular Master of International Studies program. Two of the four terms are spent in Tübingen, where students will have the opportunity to experience Europe from within by studying and living among German and other international students. The fourth term is spent at the home university, where also the Master thesis will be written and submitted. After the successful completion of the program, two Master diplomas will be issued: one Master of Arts (M.A.) by the University of Tübingen and one Master of International Studies (M.I.S.) by Seoul National University.

Tübingen is a picturesque university town and an attractive place to study with a quaint, historic old town, excellently stocked libraries, and close contacts with professors as well as high quality teaching and research. Tübingen's geographic location in Southern Germany makes it possible to explore Europe easily by taking the bus or train to France, Switzerland, Austria, Italy, the Czech Republic, and beyond. Farther destinations can also be reached by plane using the nearby airport.

REQUIREMENTS

The following minimum requirements have to be satisfied to participate in the MAKES program:

- You hold either a Bachelor or equivalent degree in either Political Science, Economics, or Business Administration.
- You are enrolled as a Master student at the Graduate School of International Studies.
- You can provide evidence of your proficiency in the English language at the level of B2/C1 CEFR or TOEFL iBT (score: 99 points) or IELTS (score: 6.5).

INFORMATION FOR YOUR APPLICATION

MAKES Selection Procedure

GSIS will conduct a selection procedure for the MAKES program each year. The required documents should be sent by e-mail to the respective persons in charge at the GSIS and the Korean Studies Section at Tübingen. An Ad Hoc Committee consisting of faculty members of both university departments will decide on the applications. Further information is provided by the Student Advisory for MAKES at SNU.

Admission to the University of Tübingen

The selected MAKES students have to apply for admission to the University of Tübingen by sending their application to the Korean Studies Tübingen, where they will be collected and examined. If all documents are complete, the applications will be forwarded to the International Office of Tübingen. Please do NOT apply via the central application platform.

Admission Deadlines

July 1st for the winter term. December 1st for the summer term.
