





NOMINATION FOR STUDENT PARTICIPATION

Program

The Chicago Council on Global Affairs and the *Financial Times* will convene the business, civic, cultural, and education leaders of global cities to engage in a multidisciplinary dialogue on the critical trends facing global cities from June 1-3, 2016 in Chicago. The second annual Forum aims to further develop the cross-disciplinary dialogue initiated last year by bringing together leaders from *all* of the vital sectors of a global city—business, culture, education, and civics—for an intense few days of discussions and meetings. Forum delegates represent leaders from across the global spectrum including mayors, CEOs, university heads, scholars, architects, and civic leaders. We are excited to once again invite the world's leading research universities to send one promising graduate student to participate in this exclusive group. The student cohort will be considered full Forum delegates with access to the plenaries and Forum events beginning on Wednesday, June 1 through the concluding lunch on Friday, June 3, 2016. The students will also have activities organized exclusively for them beginning on the evening of May 30. A detailed agenda will follow.

Cost

The Chicago Council will cover three nights hotel in Chicago and all local costs including airport transfers, shuttles to the meetings, conference fees, and the included meals and activities. Nominating universities are responsible for the international airfare. The Chicago Council will not reimburse additional meals or extracurricular activities, visa fees, or incidentals.

Qualifications

The Chicago Council is expecting approximately 30 graduate students from around the world to be nominated to attend the Chicago Forum. Ideal candidates should meet the following criteria:

- Successful completion of undergraduate studies with a degree in international affairs, political science, economics, public policy, architecture, urban planning, environmental engineering or other related fields
- Current enrollment in a master's or PhD program at the nominating institution
- A deep commitment to the planning and success of global cities and an interest in foreign policy and international affairs
- An aptitude for high-level leadership and the prospect of attaining roles with significant responsibility in the future
- Strong communication and interpersonal skills
- Be between the ages of 22-28 years old
- Fluency or professional proficiency in English
