Brain Korea 21 (BK21) Program

- BK21 Scholarships and Coverage
- 1. **Monthly stipend:** for BK21 Fellows
 - M.A. Students: KRW 700,000
 - Ph.D. Candidates: KRW 1,000,000
 - Ph.D. Coursework Students: KRW 1,300,000
- 2. Support for academic activities: for both BK21 Participants & Fellows
 - Travel grant for overseas fieldwork & academic conferences (presenter/discussant)
 - Academic journal publication fee
 - Other relevant expenses for research/academic activities recognized by the program
- 3. **Research project participation**: for both BK21 Participants & Fellows
 - Chance to participate in joint research projects with professors at GSIS
 - Special lectures, workshops, roundtables, seminars, and other academic events
 - Go on exchange programs at GSIS and universities abroad



BK21 Smart city Global Convergence

- Scholarships and Coverage
- 1. **Target:** Research scholarship students among BK21 beneficiaries
 - Only full-time students can apply for the BK21
 - A student's academic advisor should be a BK21 faculty member
 - Less than 70% of BK21 beneficiaries will be selected as Research scholarship students (non-selected graduate students still receive the other benefits except the scholarship)

2. BK21 scholarship

- KRW 700,000 for MA students / KRW 1,300,000 for Ph.D students / KRW 1,000,000 for students who have completed a Ph.D. course

Dual Degree: 1(SNU) + 1 + 0.5 or 1(SNU) + 0.5 + 1

First degree will be awarded from home institution (ex. Seoul National University) and second degree will be awarded after studying a year at a partner institution (ex. The University of Tokyo). A certificate will also be given after studying one semester at another partner institution (ex. Peking University).
