



Introducing CCAP

CCAP is a cross-cultural awareness program in the need to enhance the mutual understanding among different cultures. This program is designed to be a participatory process that augments education for international understanding in schools nationwide and promotes a culture of tolerance and mutual respect.

Main Activities

1. Regular Class

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- Spring Semester : April-June
- Fall Semester : September-November

2. Caravan

Caravan provides opportunities for schools with limited access to foreigners or different cultures due to their geographical locations. Caravan team will conduct 6 CCAP classes while they are staying. Homestay program and additional cultural exchange activities are scheduled as well.

3. Get-Together

Get-Together is a program designed to provide new activities to CCAP participants outside of the classroom. It promotes an opportunity to the participants to experience and learn each other's culture.

4. CCAP Forum

Semi-Annual Forum and Annual Forum is held at the end of each semester to evaluate CCAP activities and cultural effects with all participants. It carries out lectures, workshops, and discussions on the quality and effectiveness of CCAP classes.

How to Register

1. Volunteers

Cultural Exchange Volunteers(CEV)

For foreigners living in Korea, who are responsible, diligent and active, Register through joining our CCAP website(www.ccap.or.kr).

Every Cultural Exchange Volunteers(CEV) are required to attend the orientation and open class.

- Spring Semester : April - June
- Fall Semester : September - November
- For those who wish to continue participating, they can proceed.
- Participation Certificate is given to all participants.

Korean Interpretation Volunteers(KIV)

For Koreans who fluently speaks a foreign language, responsible, diligent and active. Register through joining our CCAP website(www.ccap.or.kr).

Every Korean Interpretation Volunteers(KIV) are required to attend the orientation and open class.

- Spring Semester : April - June
- Fall Semester : September - November
- For those who wish to continue participating, they can proceed.

(The number of participating class per semester is not fixed. It varies by individual participation rate.)

2. Participating School Teachers

Every February CCAP recruits new participating schools. Schools who wish to participate can apply through our website(www.ccap.or.kr).

Selection process will be made by the CCAP office, and final results will be announced in March.

It is mandatory for participating school teachers to attend the orientation.

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CCAP Class Procedure

Class Registration

Participating school teachers select the date of the class they wish along with Cultural Exchange Volunteer(CEV) who they want to conduct the class with, before 20-30 days.

Korean Interpretation Volunteer(KIV) Confirmation

Korean Interpretation Volunteer(KIV) can apply for the class they wish to participate.

Class Preparation

- Learn Cultural Exchange Volunteer(CEV)'s country and culture:
- Participating School Teacher, Cultural Exchange Volunteer(CEV), and Korean Interpretation Volunteer(KIV) gather and share ideas on how to conduct the class.
- Participating School Teachers should hold pre-classes going over the contents that will be covered during the CCAP class.

Evaluation and Feedback

Go to CCAP website and leave your comments and feedbacks about the class on the [Feedback & Reports] board. Participating School Teachers are required to conduct a review session with their students.

Cultural Exchange Volunteer(CEV), and Korean Interpretation Volunteer(KIV) go to the school they are informed and teach what they have prepared.

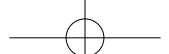
