# **Ⅲ.** Academic Requirements

## A. Requirements for Graduation

#### [Master's Program]

A minimum of 45 credits is required for graduation. GPA of 3.0 or higher out of 4.3 is required.

- 1) Students should take the 5 required courses from the major program.
  - \* Required courses for students majoring in <u>International Commerce</u>, <u>International Commerce</u>,
    - 1 International Economic Relations
    - 2 International Cooperation
    - 3 Research Methodology and Skills, Comparative Methodology (select 1 of 2)
    - 4 Understanding the East Asia,
      - -Contemporary World Politics: Theory and Case,
      - -International Trade Issues in Comparative Perspective,
      - -Studies in Regional Monetary and Financial Integration (select 1 of 4)
    - (5) Dissertation Research
  - \* Required courses for students majoring in Korean Studies:

- 2) Students should take at least 3 courses (9 credits) in their GSIS major program.
  - \* Foreign students in Korean Studies should take 4 courses (12 credits) in their major program.
  - \* You can choose major courses from other majors that are mutually recognized majors. (Refer to Mutual Recognition List)
- 3) Students must take courses (credits) to fulfill required credits (45 credits) to be eligible to graduate.
- 4) Students can take the undergraduate course (Elective Subject for Major & Requisite Subject for Major) within 6 credits. Students should get advice from advisory professor.

## [Ph.D. Program]

A minimum of 45 credits is required for graduation.

- (1) Students must take one research method course (Those who have already taken methodology course in their Master's program are exempted).
- (2) Students should take 4 courses (12 credits) or more from their major program (International Commerce, International Cooperation, and International Area Studies)
- (3) Students should take 3 courses (9 credits) or more from other major programs (International Commerce, International Cooperation, International Area Studies, and

- Korean Studies).
- (4) Students should take at least 8 elective courses (24 credits), including Dissertation Research (Students taking methodology course should take at least 7 elective courses (21 credits) or more)
  - \* "Dissertation Research" is not mandatory for students in the doctorate program. However, students may take the course up to 4 times (a maximum of 12 credits, one course per semester) and have it counted as credits required for graduation.

- Students who earn at least 3 credits in foreign language courses after enrolling in, and receive a B0 or higher, may be exempted from taking the language test their qualifying examinations. (Note: Students who take foreign language courses during their study abroad programs may be exempted from taking the test on their qualifying examinations, but will not be allowed to transfer their credits for those courses.)
- Students who have passed SNULT Level 3 or higher are exempt from the second foreign language requirement.

- Students who take courses in 'French (104.811)' or 'German (105.811)' and receive a C- or higher, are exempted from taking the respective language tests on their qualifying examinations.
- To meet the Korean language requirement, international students must score sixty points (60) or higher on the Korean language test. However, students who had received an "S" in their "Korean language or Korean culture1" or "Korean language or Korean culture2" course are exempted from taking the Korean language test.
- Korean Examination: Students can take Korean written examination (students who fail written examination once or more can substitute by taking oral examination).
- Students of Development Cooperation Policy Program can select Korean language for their qualifying examinations.
- Students may submit a language test score (taken within last two years) to meet their foreign language requirement. Language tests recognized by GSIS are as follows:
- English speakers including students who use English as an official language.
- Student can take the Language courses for qualifying Examination but it will not be included in official credit for graduation.
