COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course addresses international trade law and issues concerning electronic commerce, digitally enabled services and digital trade. Digital transformation has fundamentally changed ways international trade is conducted and enlarged the scope of issues and problems the world trading system has to deal with. D Developments in e-commerce rules at the WTO and in FTAs, emerging trade issues surrounding data flow, privacy, online platform businesses, and access to the Internet, and recent proliferation of digital trade agreements are some of the main topics this course offers to discuss and aims to provide students with basic understanding and samples of analytic approaches. In the course, lectures on trade law and policy for each topic are supplemented with selected case studies, and students' participation and researches are necessary.

There is no pre-requisite course. Any subjects dealing with international trade law, international governance issues and/or digital economy can be helpful.

Evaluation will be based on *in-class* final examination (40%), 6 case summaries (30%) and a group presentation (20%). Attendance and class participation will be favorably considered up to 10%.
