### **Course Description**

This course will cover what desk economists of IMF (International Monetary Fund) and other international financial institutions do their country surveillance and program (lending) work. The first part of the course will present the key features of the four main macroeconomic sectors (real, external, fiscal and monetary) and analysis of these sectors. The second part of the course will discuss how to assess the economic outlook of a country, prepare a baseline forecast (assuming no policy change), and design an economic and financial adjustment program, using real economic data. The course will also discuss how macroeconomic policies can be used to address poor economic performance and reduce macroeconomic imbalances. Students will be asked to develop an adjustment program for a case study country and make a presentation.

# **Prerequisites**

Some knowledge of macroeconomics and international economics, and basic Excel skills.
